Shihan (Master) Bill Viola Sr. 724-864-3495

Shihan is the authority on Martial Arts in the area with over 50 years experience.

He is credited by the Heinz History Center in conjunction with the Smithsonian Institution as the co-creator of Mixed Martial Arts "MMA" a decade before the UFC. In 2011, The Western PA Sports Museum established a permanent exhibit to honor him as one of the founding fathers of the sport. His life is the subject of the book, "Godfathers of MMA" which was the inspiration of the work film Tough Guys. Viola was inducted into USA Karate Hall of Fame and honored as the 2003 Man of the year (Lifetime Achievement). He has had the unique opportunity to teach all of his five children martial arts and instruct all of them to black belt.

Sensei Bill is the head instructor and creator of the Norwin Ninjas program. He was a USA
Karate National Champion (All-American Athlete) and recognized by Arnold Schwarzenegger
as a World Champion in 1998. Viola was inducted into Sport Karate Museum Hall of Fame in
2005, and in 2016 Pittsburgh Magazine named him one of the "40 under 40" most influential
people in the city. Sensei Bill is an Amazon #1 Best-Selling Author, film producer and founder

multi-sport event. He has experience training professional and Olympic-level athletes.

How long does the average person take to become a BLACK BELT?

Answers The average person doesn't become a black belt! Only a small percentage of people have the self-discipline to earn a legitimate black belt. If any school promises you a black belt in "X" amount of time or gives you the option to be a black belt in 2-3 years, it's a red flag that it might be a "McDojo" (fast food equivalent of martial arts). Stay away! This is an unfortunate trend among some chain schools who push contracts with a fast track or "guaranteed" black belt. Don't fall for it. At our dojo the minimum training required is 6-7 years before you can test for black belt. NON-NEGOTIABLE. Earning a black belt should be more than just memorizing techniques, or being really "good," at the physical part of karate, it's a matter of building character! *Please do your own research, we do not have information on all schools in the area.
